# THE RISING STATUS OF WOMEN IN KIRA COCHRANE'S MODERN WOMEN: 52 PIONEERS

Paul in "Feminism: A General Introduction" declares, "As a social movement, feminism largely focuses on limiting or eradicating gender inequality and promoting women's rights, interests and issues in society" (2006, p. 1). Literature reflects the emerging nature of the human conditions and social situations throughout the history. The contemporary literature paves way to the emergence of a new era for women's writings. In the early period of the feminist movement, the fight of women is to uphold their rights and they raise their voice against the educational, marital and social discrimination of the male centred society. According to Agrawal and Dutta, in *Feminism in Modern English Literature*, "Liberal feminism seeks individualistic equality of men and women through political and legal reform without altering the structure of society" (2013, p. 8). They explain their view point about the feminist writings of the present era, "The widespread interest in women's writing is related to a general reassessment and expansion of the literary canon" (2013, p. 16)

Modern women writings have a significant role to increase the holistic progress of women in the mainstream of the society. The key concept of the liberal feminism is the equality of women which fights against the subjugation of women in the male centred society. Modern feminism embraces the thirst of women to come forward to the front row of the society. It tries to wipe away the concept of the differences between men and women but to introduce the equality between them. The division between the domestic and the public realms is challenged by the modern point of view of feminism which always separates the roles of men and women from the early history of humanity. Sunita Sinha gives the goal of feminism in *Rethinking Gender: Musculinity, Femininity and Queerity in Postcolonial Indian Fiction*, "An elementary goal of feminist theory is to comprehend women's oppression in terms of race, sex, class and sexual preference and how to revolutionize it" (2016, p. 98).

The history of women which the author mentions in this book reveals the struggle of the female world to promote their individuality and the pressure which they have to

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face in the society. Stephanie Hodgson-Wright says, "One of the crucial features in feminist activity is that women come together as women in order to provide mutual support against patriarchal oppression" (2001, p. 12). Kira Cochrane enhances the spontaneity of women to draw the picture of their imagination and thirst and also challenges women to exhibit their capacities and talents to change the face of the world. *Modern Women:* 52 *Pioneers* is regarded as the showcase which displays the intelligence, strength, creativity and the thirst for the independence of women. In doing so, she defied the men who refused to climb with her when she first took up mountaineering; defied those who suggested she should stay at home to look after her daughter; and braved perils including a near-fatal avalanche, and a journey along an icy ridge where a single misstep would have meant falling thousands of metres. (2017, p. 78)

The book is a question against the patriarchal concept that woman is the synonym of weakness. The pictures of the 52 women which are displayed in the book modify and elaborate the images and the impressions of the womanhood before the readers. *Modern Women: 52 Pioneers* has a significant role among the contemporary women readers because of the reality it reveals about various dimensions of powerful female figures among the male dominated society. Women writers such as Kira Cochrane usetheir writings as a vehicle for the expression of the modern women society. They try to create an image of the strength of women which is completely different from the traditional way of representation. Feminist history should aim at balancing awareness of the continuing impact of past oppressions with the recognition of opportunities, and should seek to go beyond seeing history as either a record of progress or one of constant oppression, while acknowledging that it is not entirely random. Such history can contribute to a sense of agency by demonstrating the ability of some women to act in the most adverse circumstances, and by investigating the circumstances of past feminist gains and defeats it can inform the exploration of policy alternatives today . (2007, p. 108)

Kira Cochrane has a major role in the modern literature to explore the voices and cries of women community through her writings. As a contemporary woman writer she addresses the issues of the modern women. As a woman writer she presents a list of strong women to convince the young modern women to escape from the act of silencing to the act of raising their voice against the mistreatment of women in the society.
